
Catchment Updates

Over 150 Natural Flood Management interventions have now been installed within the Isbourne catchment, consisting of:

- 96 leaky woody dams
- 26 storage areas
 (Small areas / scrapes to hold water)
- 18 ponds
- 1 meander re-instated
- Grips along footpath
- New hedgerow
- Hillside tree planting




Hoo Farm, Laverton

Orchard Farm, Stancombe Lane




- Wildfowl & Wetland Trust have installed two ponds
- Plans to install further ponds and attenuation areas over the next few months
- Phase one started last week
